



Pupil Premium Plan 2017/2018

Principles

The Pupil Premium Grant is allocated to school depending on the number of children perceived to be socially disadvantaged. The funding runs from April 2017 to March 2018. The analysis of impact will be made after final assessments in the Summer term of 2018.

In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged. Likewise, we also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil the school has legitimately identified as being vulnerable.

We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all the pupils, regardless of social standing or mobility and thus, we ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, including ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.

Pupil Premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.

- To improve boys' attainment in reading, writing and maths across school (especially in Y2, Y3 and Y5).
- To improve the percentage of children in school who are assessed to be working at the 'higher standard' in all subject areas.

Engagement

- To offer a curriculum that includes a wider range of enriching and meaningful experiences.
- For more families to access support offered across the St. James' community (ongoing from previous plan)
- To engage and inspire all learners.
